



# Sexual Behavior in Children and Youth

## Overview of Treatment for Children Impacted by Problematic Sexual Behavior of Other Youth

When a child is sexually abused by a youngster exhibiting Problematic Sexual Behaviors (PSB), the child and the child's nonoffending caregiver could benefit from Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT). To best support the family, it is important to facilitate the engagement of both the caregiver and the child in treatment and encourage their gradual participation in skill-building and trauma processing therapeutic activities.

This webinar will provide an overview of treatment for caregivers and children impacted by the Problematic Sexual Behavior (PSB) of other youth using a Trauma-focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT) framework. Dr. Deblinger will focus on the sequela for the impacted child and the caregiver. Information and qualities of evidence-based treatment for the family will also be addressed.
